A Message from Adminstrative Coodinator Loomis

While a majority of 2016 was spent managing SRT's organizational transition from the Lake & McHenry Counties Fire Department SRT to the MABAS Divisions 4 & 5 SRT, 2017 focused heavily on team operations. We started out the year by updating the format and content of all seven of the special team standard operating guidelines (SOGs) and the Administrative SOG. Hours of work went into standardizing language across all documents and updating or adding sections to address new and unwritten policies and practices.

Team leaders/coordinators, the operations chiefs and myself also implemented and refined procedures for End of Year Training Forms. Training spreadsheets used to track SRT training throughout the year together with these forms ensure that all team members meet their annual training requirements. Those that did not complete their required training were removed from team rosters for the following calendar year - a new policy included in the SOG updates.

Other notable accomplishments for the year include updating the SRT box card guides and templates for both MABAS divisions, working with the Mechanics Team to establish an extensive approved vendor list and formal asset management plan and developing a formal policy for the use of the I Am Responding communication tool for all team members and the MABAS dispatch agencies.

In addition to the regular operating budget expenditures, SRT oversaw the purchase of several capital budget items including a new sonar trailer, a swiftwater inflatable craft and surface supplied air equipment for divers. SRT's operating expenditures also came in over \$45,000 under budget, allowing us to increase our contingency fund and reduce the 2018 member assessments/dues by almost \$22,000.

We made huge strides in 2017 on some important projects, while still managing the day to day operations that keep our special teams ready and able to respond to a wide range of emergencies. We look forward to continued success in 2018 as we constantly work to improve team operations and the administration of SRT.



Hazardous

Materials Team

Responsible for controlling and mitigating hazardous materials incidents, including identification, assessment, containment/confinement and decontamination.

Mechanics Team

Responsible for supporting all other teams during both training and incidents, by ensuring all assets (vehicles and equipment) are operating properly and reliably on a day to day basis.

Technical Rescue Team

Responsible for managing special rescue situations in the areas of rope rescue, confined space, structural collapse and trench rescue.

- Participated in a multi-agency trench drill at the Lake County Public Works facility.
- Began developing a formal inventory process for team equipment.









Dive Team

Responsible for the rescue and/or recovery of drowning victims (often also assists with evidence recovery).

Sonar Team

Responsible for searching bodies of water for victims and/or evidence using both side and sector scan equipment.

Responsible for mitigating fires in areas challenging for firefighters equipped with standard gear, especially heavily wooded areas or open spaces.
