
# 2020 ANNUAL REPORT

# A Message from Administrative Coordinator Christina Loomis

What a year we experienced in 2020! Coming off of the November 2019 adoption of our Strategic Plan, SRT was poised in January to dive into the work outlined in this guiding document. It became quickly apparent, however, that 2020 would not be the year we were expecting. The COVID-19 pandemic had far reaching affects on SRT and required us to reimagine how to serve our member agencies in this new normal.

When state and local restrictions prevented us from providing inperson training in the spring, we pivoted to on-line training for all our teams. In June and July, we offered all teams members two on-demand training opportunities specific to their team and the




MABAS system. When COVID-19 numbers surged again in the fall, we provided training on Zoom, focusing on basic skills and team update information. We also took the extra time afforded us without regular training to make progress on a few administrative projects including launching a new website with added functionality and mobile compatibility and starting to inventory both paper and electronic records.

Despite the challenges brought on by the COVID-19 pandemic, SRT did make significant progress on several objectives outlined in our Strategic Plan. We developed and disseminated a Risk Hazard Assessment Questionnaire to gather information about the possible hazards in each of the communities we serve, allowing us to better assess the readiness of our special teams. Our team leaders/coordinators spearheaded the effort to inventory all of SRT's assets – a first for many of our teams! We also appointed six team members to leadership positions within our Dive, Hazardous Materials and Technical Rescue Teams as we continue to see the need for succession planning.

This pandemic tested our organization but has, ultimately, strengthened our leadership, increased our adaptability and proven our resilience. We are ready to face the challenges that 2021 may continue bring and to reinvigorate our work on the goals and objectives outlined in our Strategic Plan. We look forward to the hard work we know lies ahead in the new year!


